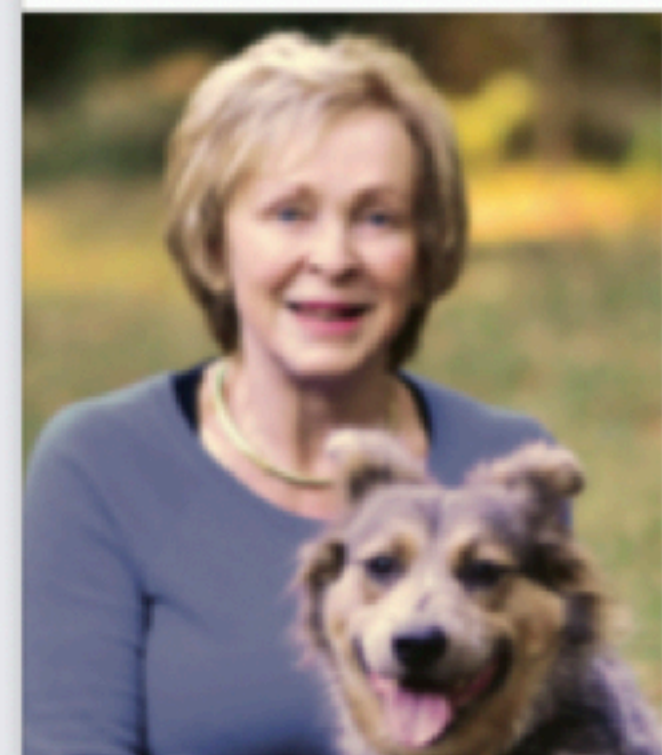


# Candace J. Campbell



It is with great sadness we share that Candace Jones Campbell of Brentwood, TN, passed away unexpectedly on May 4, 2021, due to a stroke. We lost her way too soon.

Born to Christena Belle Jones and PGA golf pro Raymond Andrew Jones on a snowy day in Indianapolis on December 16, 1946. Candace grew up in nearby Anderson, Indiana, and after a brief time in Wilmington, Delaware, called Nashville home for nearly 50 years.

She was affectionately known as CC, especially among children, whom she taught truth, integrity, and faith, primarily by example. She was hardworking, active, adventurous, and multi-talented. Friends and family would turn to her for advice that was both insightful and honest. Candace loved to travel, with Italy and France among her favorite destinations. At home and abroad, she delighted in museums, fine arts, and Broadway shows.

Every home she built or renovated was impeccably decorated, with equal attention paid to her outdoor surroundings. She was a certified Master Gardener, reflecting her love of the outdoors and constant desire to learn. Her family fondly remembers her affection for her dogs and other animals, and willingness to explore creeks, beaches, and parks.

Her twin passions were education and advancing healthcare, and she worked throughout her lifetime to share those passions with others. A graduate of Belmont University School of Nursing, she served patients at Vanderbilt University Medical Center for decades on main campus, at 100 Oaks and in multiple outpatient clinics. She also provided homecare through the Visiting Nurse Service of Tennessee and Cigna's IntraCorp as a medical case manager helping families throughout the region care for loved ones who endured catastrophic injury and illness. She also was a Professor at Columbia State Community College, teaching medical terminology, and was a Certified Case Manager and Certified Legal Nurse Consultant.

Candace was preceded in death by her parents and infant son. She is also now reunited with the beloved dogs that she adopted: Rusty, a wolf hybrid, and Ascha, an Australian Shepherd/Cattle Dog.

Candace will be deeply missed by her children, Laura Campbell of Brentwood and Kristen Haggard of Houston, Texas. CC was especially proud of her grandchildren, Campbell Jeffrey, a student at Duke University and graduate of Franklin Road Academy, and Hayley Haggard, who attends The University of Texas at Austin School of Law after receiving her undergraduate degree there.
